

Estevan Public Youth Centre (EPYC) was started as a United Way Estevan Community Impact Project in 2020. Now a registered charity, EPYC continues to receive support through United Way Estevan. With changes in EPYC Executive Directors in 2024, United Way Estevan's expertise has been valuable to help new EDs make needed connections within the community.





In addition to regularly connecting with Member Agencies and Community Impact Partners, other community organizations have been invited to meet with United Way Estevan's Board of Directors. So far, the UWE Board has met with Southeast Advocates and Estevan Police Service's Police and Crisis Team (PACT). These conversations enhance United Way Estevan's ability to understand and represent the entire community.

Community Impact Story

In 2024, United Way Estevan prioritized funding for agencies and projects that provide mental wellness supports. One example is United Way Estevan's support of the Envision Counselling & Support Centre's Intake Worker.



"At Envision Counselling and Support Centre, we know that people often reach out during some of the most difficult times in their lives. As an Intake Worker, I have the privilege of supporting individuals through various stressors, from past trauma to current crises. One recent call truly demonstrated the impact of compassionate support in times of urgent need.

A woman called, feeling emotionally overwhelmed, isolated, and unsure of where to turn. She had endured a violent past relationship, family dysfunction, and had just been laid off from her job that week. With all these stresses weighing on her, she was struggling to cope and shared that she had been experiencing heavy suicidal thoughts.

I listened without judgment, allowing her to express the full weight of her emotions. In that moment, she needed someone to hear her, and this alone helped her feel a bit lighter. I reassured her that her feelings were valid, acknowledged the challenges she had faced, and offered comfort. Together, we worked through grounding and breathing techniques to manage her emotions and help her focus on her strengths.

We also created a safety plan, helping her look at her life from a more positive perspective. She thanked me for listening and for being there when she needed support most. Before the call ended, I connected her to resources, including Income Assistance and unemployment services, and helped her enroll in one of Envision's programs. We scheduled a follow-up appointment with an ongoing counsellor, and I asked if she would like a call the next day, to which she agreed.



The next day, she shared that she was feeling better and had used the grounding techniques we discussed. She thanked me again for checking in, and we revisited the tools that had helped her. She continues to stay in touch, and her story reminds us of the powerful impact of simply being there for someone during a crisis. Sometimes, all people need is a compassionate ear and validation of their feelings. This experience demonstrates the importance of accessible, immediate support, showing that being present when it matters most can make a significant difference."

Educate

In 2024, with the help of Saskatchewan Blue Cross, United Way Estevan brought United Way Calgary's Natural Supports Simulation website to Estevan to help support community members develop skills to support each other. The website has been shared with parents through school newsletters and emails, with other agencies through interagency communications, and shared with the wider community through posters and social media.

"The Natural Supports Simulation is an incredible resource for our community. It allows participants to step into different scenarios and have genuine conversations, helping everyone to better understand the unique challenges that young people encounter. By exploring various roles and



concerns, this simulation not only helps individuals develop their skills but also fosters a more caring and informed community that is committed to supporting our youth. It allows people to learn at their own speed, in private, or in a classroom setting."


